1.LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth! You have set your glory in the heavens.² Through the praise of children and infants you have established stronghold against your enemies ,to silence the foe and the avenger.³ When I consider your heavens the work of your fingers ,the moon and the stars, which you have set in place,⁴ what is mankind that you are mindful of them, human beings that you care for them? ⁵You have made them^[d] a little lower than the angels and crowned them^[f] with glory and honor.⁶ You made them rulers over the works of your hands; you put everything under their^[g] feet:⁷ all flocks and herds, and the animals of the wild,⁸ the birds in the sky, and the fish in the sea, all that swim the paths of the seas.⁹ LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!

Romans 5 1-5 Page 1068 Peace and Hope

5 Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we^[a] have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ² through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we^[b] boast in the hope of the glory of God. ³ Not only so, but we^[c] also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; ⁴ perseverance, character; and character, hope. ⁵ And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.
