# Kingdom Authority and Power Luke 10:8–11, 17–20. (8/10) HANOUT

Jesus gives authority to His followers—what does Kingdom power look like in action?

Jesus' disciples are sent out, empowered with Kingdom authority. The question is: *What does Kingdom power look like in action?* 

The Big Idea this week is: **Kingdom power is not about domination or pride - it's about healing, proclaiming, defeating darkness, and rejoicing in salvation.** 

## 1. Kingdom Power Heals and Proclaims (vv. 8-11)

Jesus sends His followers to proclaim: "The Kingdom of God has come near to you."

Signs of the Kingdom: healing the sick, demonstrating God's compassion, embodying His reign. Kingdom citizens are called to bring hope and healing - in prayer, acts of kindness, and sharing Christ.

Q: Do people experience the nearness of God's Kingdom through my presence?

## 2. Kingdom Power Defeats Darkness (vv. 17-19)

The disciples return rejoicing: "Even the demons are subject to us in your name!" Jesus affirms: "I saw Satan fall like lightning."

The Kingdom advances, pushing back spiritual darkness. Kingdom authority is not about arrogance but about confidence in Jesus' name.

Q: Are we aware that spiritual battles are real? Our prayers, our witness, our obedience carry authority in Christ.

### 3. Kingdom Power Produces Humble Joy (vv. 20)

Jesus redirects their joy: "Do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven."

The greatest miracle is not what we do for God, but what He has done for us in Christ. Kingdom power looks like humility, not pride; gratitude, not self-glory. True power is marked by humility and service, not boasting. True joy is rooted in belonging to God, not in results or victories.

Q: Am I more excited about what I do for Jesus, or what Jesus has done for me?

### 4. What Does Kingdom Power Look Like in Action?

In summary, Kingdom power looks like:-

• Healing the broken. • Proclaiming the nearness of God's reign. • Pushing back the darkness with Christ's authority. • Living with humble joy, anchored in salvation.

If we are connected to Jesus we shall have the Holy Spirit's power available in and through us. If not, we won't
